New Record Price for a Single Post Card!

On June 20, 2015, a new record price for a post card was reached at a sale at the Gaertner auction house in southern Germany. The card sold for 166,000 euros (\$188,000 U.S.). After commissions, the total price will be more than 200,000 euros.

There is very little chance that any card in our collections will be worth anything close to the amount realized for the card in question. It was sent from Pablo Picasso to his friend, French poet Guillaume Apollinaire, is dated September 5, 1918, and has an authenticated drawing by Picasso, that "can be considered part of the artist's cubist still life series." The image on the other side of the card is a simple aerial view of the southwestern French town of Pau.

The McMaster Postcard Project

In 2008, McMaster received a donation of over 4,000 cards, and they are finally going to try to do something with them. Using a crowdsourcing campaign, they are asking people to literally fill in the blanks for each of the cards in the collection. They have scanned all of the cards, fronts and backs, and would like input from anyone who would like to contribute. You can look at just fronts, just backs or have the web site shuffle the cards for you and view them at random. They need people to copy the captions on the cards to the text boxes beside them on the web pages for the individual cards, so everyone can help even if they know nothing about the cards. Just copy the information into the boxes. Anyone who has any additional information to contribute about a card can enter it into a comments section via the web page. Learn more at http://postcards.mcmaster.ca.

Unfortunately, there is no link between the front and back of each card, and no way to identify which front goes with which back, since the cards/backs weren't scanned in any particular order. I tried a few groups of images, and saw cards I'd already seen after a just few screens, so it doesn't seem possible to view cards consecutively, unless one manually increments the image number in the web address (URL or URI or whatever they're calling it this week). If one remembers or locates more information about a card later on, it would be difficult to get back to it without entering the exact URL. There is also no way to add more comments to an entry later, although it is possible to note that the comments are an addendum to previous comments posted about the same card. In short, it's best to enter all of the information about the card at once. The information that you enter will not appear if you find the card again, so it's best to keep track of that too. They will compile all of the comments for each card at the end and bring the fronts and backs together then. They want more than one person to comment on the cards because they expect that they will get more information if the fields are not already filled in.

Minutes of the Meeting of June 24, 2015

Held at Fortinos, Plains Road, Burlington

Jon was tired, so turned the meeting over immediately to Beth Mills. Beth has developed a Facebook page for the club, which will be maintained by Sanna Sinclair. The cover pictures will change every 2 months. As of the June 24, the site has received 7 "likes". Beth copied information from our web site to get the page started. You can look at the page at https://www.facebook.com/GHPCClub or link from our web site. An ad for our Dundas show and sale will be included. Beth thinks it is the only post card entity on Facebook so far. Those logging on with a valid Facebook account can also upload their own post card images to the site. We discussed various aspects of the page and thanked Beth for getting us started in such fine fashion.

Beth moved on to give us a presentation entitled "Ontario Agricultural College: The Early Years in Post Cards". Always a genealogy buff, Beth gave background on OAC's longest serving Principal and President, Dr James Mills, Beth's great-grandfather, and provided a more-or-less chronological history primarily enhanced by the use of postcards of the various campus buildings. James Mills began life in a farming family in 1840, between Bond Head and Schomberg, in West Gwillimbury, and the family later moved east to a community near Lake Skugog. He worked on his parents' farm at Duncairn, but lost an arm in a threshing accident, so turned to education to prepare him for a career since farm work was no longer an option. He received a B.A. from Victoria Wesleyan College in Cobourg in 1868. He married in 1869 and moved his family to Brantford, where he became principal of Brantford High School. In 1879 and for the following 25 years, he directed the Ontario Agricultural College as Principal, launching the Farmers' Institutes of Ontario in 1885, and initiating the dairy short course in 1893. He negotiated degree-granting status with the University of Toronto in 1888. He obtained private sector support for construction of Massey Hall & Library, constructed in 1901, funded by Walter Massey, president of Massey-Harris. 1903 saw the creation of the MacDonald Institute for women's studies which became a top home economics institute by the 1950's. Beth recounted numerous accomplishments and impressive growth of the Ontario Agricultural College, construction of many buildings and development of numerous programs under her grandfather. We thanked Beth for an excellent presentation.

Jon discussed the show and sale which takes place in September. So far, he has no idea how many dealers will

be participating or the number of tables that they will require. We may have a new dealer named Larry Kreel at the show. Sadly, we have lost noted dealer and club member Derek Dalton. Jon attended Derek's funeral in Barrie on June 9th.

As far as sales of the club's book were concerned, spring was miserable, but sales are slowly picking up. The Hamilton Store took another 6 copies. Last month, Jon gave a presentation to the Pennsylvania German Folklore Society in Beamsville, and sold 2 copies. A sales table was set up for a day at Battlefield House from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., which resulted in 0 sales. 2 classrooms of students in grades 7 and 8 went through, and Susan Ramsay printed post cards for the students to use, and for which the postage would be paid if they used the postal code. Only 14 were mailed. According to Jon, the majority of students had no idea of what post cards were, how they were used, or how they would get to the recipients.

7 books were sold on June 12th at the Juravinski Centre in the café, along with 6 or 10 post cards. On the 18th, Ron Sinclair sold 6 books at the Municipal Heritage Awards. Jon showed us a few old cards, including a real photo card of Stinson School. He showed the card to Harry Stinson who has developed the building into condominiums. The shot shows the yard of one of the houses across the street, which Stinson also bought. He is trying to get permission from the city to restore the building and yard to the state shown in the picture. Discussion moved to the Tivoli Theatre, and the theatre on Mary Street, which it was noted, was the Century Theatre. Jon has been requested to speak to an Arts and Books group in October.

Jon gave a total of the funds in our bank account, noting that not all bills have been received. Most have been paid, including the Hall of Fame for room rental, etc. Jon will pay for an ad to advertise the show in one antique magazine "the Upper Canadian" [which was re-launched as Canadian Antiques and Vintage" as of the September/October issue].

Jon noted the problem of getting younger people to join the club. Ron Sinclair noted that the Binbrook and Glanford Heritage Society membership has been declining since the mid-1980's. As 4 or 5 new members sign up, 10 or more become home-bound or pass away. Binbrook is becoming a boom town, so perhaps new members will result. People don't have time to spend on club activities. Sites like Postcrossing, to which Sana Sinclair introduced us a few years back, are easy to access from home, many people commute, and families have many commitments, such as sports leagues for their children, etc. In today's busy world, people don't have a lot of time for this sort of activity. It was noted that post cards are a nice gift. Don Babb noted that they could be used to send thank you messages, to remind people to call back, stay in touch, etc.

Jon showed a partial set of cards that he'd acquired showing 5 of the 7 Wonders of the Ancient World, and a card sent from a different country, that was from Luckie Shell at King & Longwood.

Elections were held:

As expected, there was no stampede of volunteers or nominators for any of the executive positions. As a result, the four members of the current executive who were in attendance at the meeting agreed to stand as candidates for another year. Acceptance of the slate of candidates was moved by Ivan Killins, seconded by Larry Cherns, and carried by the rest of the group. By acclamation, the new executive is composed of:

The membership list was discussed. Peggy will try to get it updated and distributed soon.
